

Kyoto is the cultural heart of Japan. The former home of the Emperor, Kyoto was the capital of Japan for over 1,000 years. This rich history lives on through Kyoto's people, food, shrines, temples, gardens, and festivals. Students will earn 3 to 8 units of CSU/UC transferable credits towards their degree while experiencing the beauty and uniqueness of Kyoto and the Kansai area. In their free time students may want to travel independently to the capital city of Tokyo or nearby Osaka, famous for its neon lights.

YOUR PROGRAM INCLUDES

- Accommodation in twin or triple-bedded studio apartments in a centrally-located, WiFi-enabled aparthotel.
- Orientation program in Kyoto including an orientation meeting with AIFS staff, information packet, welcome dinner and guided, half-day walking tour of Kyoto.
- Pre-loaded smart card (IC) valid for travel on JR trains, trams, subways and buses in the Kyoto metropolitan area as well as at select convenience stores, shops and restaurants.
- Entrance to Eikando or Nanzenji Temple, and a guided tour of Nijo Castle.
- A traditional Japanese cooking class.
- Full-day excursion to Nara including round-trip transportation, a walking tour of the historical park with a professional, English-speaking guide and entrance to Tōdai-ji (Great Eastern Temple).
- Entrance with guided tour to a Zen Buddhist Temple, including an introduction to zazen meditation and a shōjin ryōri (monk-style) lunch.
- Farewell group meal.
- The services of the AIFS Tour Manager for information, personal advising/counseling and 24-hour emergency contact service.
- Medical and Travel Assistance Insurance policy.

FEES

Based on an enrollment of 25+ participants, the fee per person is \$3,375. This fee excludes airfare, optional Hiroshima excursion, passport or visa fees if applicable, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, any Citrus College tuition or administrative fees, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the Citrus College faculty and anything not specified. These fees are guaranteed not to change as a result of fluctuations in the \$ exchange rate.

OPTIONAL HIROSHIMA EXCURSION

An optional weekend in Hiroshima is available, including a travel for round-trip transportation, two nights' hotel accommodation with daily breakfast, entrance to Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum, full-day excursion to Miyajima including round-trip ferry tickets from Miyajimaguchi Station to Miyajima, entrance to Itsukushima Shrine and the services of an AIFS Representative for \$565.

A course in elementary Japanese grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation which aims at understanding, speaking, reading, and writing simple Japanese and serves as an introduction to Japanese geography and culture.
